In terms of the work output, HEM experienced immense growth and progress over the course of 2019. During this year, HEM assisted less than five-year old orphans, elderly and widows in Kampala, Kyaka II and Nakivale. Also, it helped a big number of poor people to initiate income generating activities through saving culture and credit. A considerable number of women and youth associations were motivated to handcraft, tailoring, agriculture, apiculture and other various income generating activities. Finally, churches were planted and leaders were trained. HEM staff from different sites provided individual and collective counseling services to refugees and other vulnerable people.

HEM's work was recognized through its Executive Director, Pr. DUSABE BONY (DUSABUMUREMYI BONAVENTURE) who is the catalyst for protecting the rights of his fellow refugees and other vulnerable people especially orphans in Uganda, Africa and the World. HEM is immensely grateful to donors and stakeholders; and is proud of the achievements in the previous years and in 2019 in particular.

HEM remains grateful to our generous partners and donors for making its work possible. We are thankful to the Government of Uganda, OPM and UNHCR for their partnership, support and cooperation. ### Background

Hope for Eternity Ministry (HEM) is a Christian and Charity Organization, established in Uganda on 12 May 2013 by Refugees for Refugees and other vulnerable people. HEM aims at bringing back hope to refugees and other vulnerable people mostly orphans, elderly, women and the youth for eternity. HEM is a registered NGO by the Uganda Government under **Reg. N°: IDN122056895NB** and **Permit N°: INDP11873895NB**. It is allowed to work countrywide. On **14<sup>th</sup> January 2019**, HEM signed a Memorandum of Understanding with the Government of Uganda allowing it to operate in Uganda Refugee Settlements.

## A. Refugee Support and Humanitarian Actions

### A.1. Assistance to Less than Five Years Total Orphans

HEM assisted children living in miserable conditions especially less than five years total orphans. The services rendered to them include the provision of milk, porridge, clothes, soaps and providing medical services, advocacy and counseling for caregivers.





## B. Community Development Initiatives

### B.1. Promotion of a Saving and Credit Culture

HEM helped local people to initiate Saving and Credit Cooperatives (SACCOs) as a financial inclusion activity. BUKASA-KIZUNGU SACCO and NAKIVUBO WOMEN SACCO were started. Nowadays, the two SACCOs operate in five areas: Bukasa-Kizungu, Nakivubo, Masanafu, Kyaka II Refugee Settlement and Nakivale Refugee Settlement. There also now are plans to begin to develop SACCOs in other refugee settlements and rural areas.



I am a staff of HEM since January 2019. Before joining HEM I was very poor, my children were not at school. I was jailed many times in Kampala City because of hawking. I went in Kyaka II Refugee Settlement and life became worse. HEM helped me to regain hope for life. Today, all my children are at school, I have my own house. I am the Director of Bright Junior School located in Bukasa-Kizungu. I got in touch with HEM in 2016. We had a school but failed to manage it due to poverty and were going to abandon the school. Most of the school parents could not pay school fees because many of them were refugees. We approached the Director of HEM who accepted to help the school paying school fees to 102 pupils. With HEM's support all our school PLE 2019 candidates passed with 1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grades. In addition, HEM provided craft trainings to our parents, loans to the schools and parents. Today, HEM is known and popular in our village. I wish HEM to grow up. (0753630252/ 0782581207).

- 4. Enhance environmental protection within and around refugee settlements at 80%***

### ***E.3. Promotion of SACCOs and Self-help Fund for Vulnerable***

- 1. Increase the number of beneficiaries / members 100%***
- 2. Increase the number of loans given at 80%***
- 3. Improve the life standards of vulnerable people especially women and youth 70%***

## Challenges and Opportunities

HEM is facing a number of **challenges** in its daily activities while working with urban refugees or in refugee settlements.

- The serious challenge is the **lack of funds** which means we reach a fewer vulnerable people who need our services, while those who come to our offices seeking for help are many because they trust in us.
- We have also the challenge of **getting services** needed from various offices due to our status which may be due to **neglect and ignorance** of refugees' rights and/or corruption.
- HEM is facing a **political problem** because of the crisis relationship between our host country and our countries of origin.
- Finally, HEM does not have **secured office premises** where it works especially in refugee settlements.
- The **transport problem** is a barrier to our activities because we are reaching our clients by foot or by hiring motorcycles. Our work becomes hard or impossible especially in rain seasons.

Given HEM's contributions as described to the peace and prosperity to those who are most vulnerable, and in light of the above challenges, it is therefore sincerely **requested** that:

- Funding organizations including UNHCR, Government of Uganda and others consider HEM among other organizations to be funded to support refugee initiatives. This will help refugees not to be a burden to the hosting country but a contributor to national development.
- OPM and UNHCR provide to HEM transport facilities and offices so that its activities may be fruitful and help to achieve its goals.
- OPM and UNHCR make regular visits to HEM's locations to witness the activities and the achievements, so that they can strengthen HEM's activities and provide relevant advices.
- The Government of Uganda and OPM in particular protect HEM against insecurity and threats caused by its status.
- The local governments facilitate HEM implement new projects and protect their activities.
- The international community intervene in conflicts between refugees' host countries, and their countries of origin when such conflict negatively affects refugee initiatives, their families, and their lives, and especially when it hinders their productivity and development.
- The international community provide regulatory measures to protect refugee initiatives once their status is terminated.

## Conclusion

First of all, the management of Hope for Eternity Ministry (HEM), through the Executive Director, takes this opportunity to thank God for the inspiration to create HEM and for God's help along the way from the beginning up to the present. It was a long and difficult way but HEM is still on its journey and is in a good truck to the destination.

We also thank the Government of Uganda for hosting us as refugees and giving us the right to start HEM as an organisation so that we can develop ourselves and develop our fellow refugees. We thank also OPM and UNHCR for their support, cooperation and advice. We realized that every person is capable of reaching any goal once an opportunity is given. HEM has shown showed that once refugees are given opportunity and support; they no longer need to be a burden to the hosting communities but also can contribute to the development of the nation. HEM has helped and continues to help a significant number of refugees and other vulnerable people in hosting communities.

We also take this occasion to thank our fellow refugees for your patience with various problems, we know you often struggle to use the little means you have to survive and sustain your families. Dear fellow refugees, we thank you so much for your cooperation, encouragement and support. May God bless you abundantly!

Finally, we thank all our donors and stakeholders and other people or institutions who have contributed in one way or another to HEM's achievements over the past seven years.

All in all, there are more achievements than are mentioned in this report. Everyone who wants to see the real profile of HEM is welcome to visit HEM offices: Kampala (Bukasa and Masanafu), or Kyaka II Refugee Settlement and Nakivale Refugee Settlement; with Kyangwali and Kiryangondo coming alive soon. Although, HEM did not receive any financial support from UNHCR to help fulfill its objectives, with the little means; we moved on to assist refugees and other vulnerable people. HEM is committed to go ahead. We are going to use our hands, knowledge, skills so that we meet our goals. We are thankful to everybody who assisted us, is now assisting us, and those who will be assisting HEM to meet our goals in future.
