



4.1. Achievements in Kyaka II Refugee settlement

4.1.1. Orphans' care and Support to vulnerable people



In April 2021, 450 Refugees was supported by HEM: 226 vulnerable children (25 total orphans, 201 partial orphans), 16 elderly, and 162 vulnerable people among them 7 nationals (Ugandans), 62 pastors given training in Bible school. The support given was: caw milk, powder milk, porridge, fruits, food, clothing, health care etc.





As usual baby total orphans and vulnerable children from Kyaka II Refugee settlement have been given care and support from HEM organization. They have received porridge, cow milk, powder milk, fruits, agges, clothes, medical care and more.

4.2.1. Orphans' care and other different activities

In April 2021, we helped 110 refugees. Among them, we supported **83 vulnerable children** (26 total orphans, 23 partial orphans, 34 other vulnerable children). 8 elderly, and other 19 refugees with problems (8 children, 6 women, 5 men); were given advice and their problems were solved. The support given was: cow milk, powder milk, porridge, food, clothing, health care, counselling, family visit, advocacy etc...

4.3.1. Support and care for orphans, elderly and others

In April 2021, HEM Kyangwali supported 82 vulnerable Refugees: 56 orphans (13 total orphans less than five years, 9 total orphans more than to five years, and 34 partial orphans), 8 widows and 7 disabled (3 children, 4 adult). We have 15 in music training. The supported were given: food, milk, fruits, salt, soaps, porridge, etc...

4.5.1. Support, Handcraft and tailoring machine






4.5.2. Food and school material distribution to vulnerable children
