May God bless all of you.





4.1. Achievements in Kyaka II Refugee settlement

4.1.1. Orphans' care and Support to vulnerable people



In Kyaka II, we are supporting 280 vulnerable children. Primarily 84 were supported in May 2021: (23 total orphans, 61 partial orphans). We supported also 42 elderly among others. The support given was: caw milk, powder milk, porridge, fruits, food, health care etc. We appreciate so much our donors, staff and beneficiaries.



HEM is promoting business to caregivers so that they can have some income to facilitate their families. In each Kitenge (Clothes) sold, they gain 2,000 Ugsh. HEM Kyaka II buy them and give them to caregivers for selling. This new project shall help a lot their families, because the 19,000Ugsh given to one person every month by UNHCR is not enough!!!

4.2. Achievements in Nakivale Refugee settlement

4.2.1. Orphans' care and other different activities

In May 2021, HEM Nakivale supported 106 orphans (26 total orphans, 24 partial orphans, 56 other vulnerable children) and 14 elderly.

The support given was: caw milk, powder milk, porridge, food, health care, counselling, family visit, advocacy etc...

In May 2021, HEM Kyangwali supported 53 orphans (22 total orphans and 31 partial orphans. We supported 29 elderly and 2 disabled. The supported were given: Food, milk, fruits, salt, porridge, small fish,...



4.5.1. Support, Handcraft and tailoring machine


In Masanafu HEM supported 6 total orphans, 4 partial orphans and 2 old women. They have been given soap, food and small fish.
